

In January, Louise lost her job and, due to mobility issues, she was unable to start a new job or easily move around the city. She really wanted to return to work, and felt extremely lost and concerned for her future. "I've always worked," Louise stated, "it gives me purpose."

Our Client Services team was eager to answer Louise's call for help. We provided Louise with a hamper full of non-perishable and nutritious, fresh food, and delivered it right to her door. Our partners at Crystal Kids assisted by delivering her hamper.

Crystal Kids operates a drop-in center for homeless and impoverished youth offering food and structured programs. The Community Outreach aspect of this organization acts as a depot for Edmonton's Food Bank where individuals can pick up food hampers, or in Louise's case, they are delivered directly to her.

"I can't explain how happy I am!" Louise exclaimed in a phone call to Edmonton's Food Bank. This extra assistance means the world to Louise as we help her persevere through a difficult time.

Louise is looking forward to getting back on her feet and back into the workforce. She is hoping her health will improve in time for her to explore job opportunities as a bus driver when school starts again in the fall.

"Sometimes, life puts up hurdles," Louise explained, "and you just have to go over them!" Louise exudes optimism, gratitude, and enthusiasm because of the generosity and compassion of our community. Thank you for your unwavering support throughout difficult times.
