The cost of food and basic necessities are rising to levels not seen in generations, and this means that more people in our community are being stretched to consider whether to pay their rent or heating, or buy food.

Through the generosity of our donors, volunteers, and our partners we've continued to address the growing demand in our community. Pursuing Our Mission in Our Community

Our MISSION STATEMENT is to be stewards in the collection of surplus and donated food for the effective distribution, free of charge, to people in need in our community while seeking solutions to the causes of hunger.

The first part of this statement talks about stewardship, meaning careful and responsible management. The focus of our work is the distribution of food to low-income people or people in need.

The second part of our mission talks about our commitment to poverty prevention or reduction through initiatives like our Beyond Food program.

While some individuals and families do access services directly from our organization, Edmonton's Food Bank is a central warehouse and referral centre for a network of over 300 agencies, shelters, food depots, and community groups serving people in need.

The Food Bank offers a variety of different services including different types of hampers. Hamper contents vary depending on what is donated, specific dietary needs (like diabetic or celiac), or cultural requests.

Hampers are prepared by the Food Bank or one of our affiliated agencies. We also work with groups like the Edmonton Police Service to make emergency food packages for people in need.

Schools, soup kitchens, and shelters access food through meal and snack programs supported by Edmonton's Food Bank. Examples include Hope Mission, Operation Friendship, Boys & Girls Clubs Big Brothers Big Sisters, Boyle Street, Mustard Seed, Jasper Place Health and Wellness Centre, and about 80 schools. In May of 2022, we served 31,559 people through hamper programs which is more than double our numbers in May of 2020 at the height of the pandemic. We distributed 504,979 kilograms of food to our partner agencies and directly to individuals and families in need. In May of 2020, this number was only 324,933 kilograms.



We do not receive any operational dollars from any level of government. We rely on individuals, foundations, and community-minded businesses for food and funds. Volunteers are also essential to our work.
