Message from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Since 1981, Edmonton's Food Bank has been at the forefront of food security. For 44 years, we have been salvaging/rescuing surplus food from the food industry, collecting donations, and providing it free to vulnerable neighbours.

Last year was particularly challenging, as we surpassed our record number of clients served in a single month (over 47,000). Despite the growing need, we remain hopeful thanks to our generous community. Over the festive season, your support helped us achieve our monetary goal and we reached 92% of our food goal. For 2025, there is still much work ahead. Together, we must continue to support one another and help set people up for success.

In 2024, our impact has been felt across Edmonton. Your contributions helped make this possible:

- Nearly 80,000 unique individuals throughout Edmonton received a food hamper, with an average of 41,600 people supported monthly all year.
- 380 community partners, including soup kitchens, shelters, and other vital agencies, received food for their programming, allowing us to collectively provide over 450,000 meals and snacks monthly.
- Our warehouse team salvaged surplus food, preventing waste and feeding those in need. In 2024 alone, we rescued more than 4 million kilograms of food, representing 60% of all the food we distributed.

The food we share within our community has a direct and profound impact. As we move into another year of uncertainty, we encourage everyone to work together to address the root cause of food insecurity: poverty.

You are essential to the work we do, and together, we are building a stronger, more supportive community. Let's continue to focus on kindness and the positive changes we can create. Thank you once again for your generous donations of time, money, and food.

EDMONTON'S FOOD BANK SEED BANK

Inspired by the Edmonton Public Library's original seed bank concept!

Last summer and fall, we asked local garden centers and seed retailers to donate unsold seeds. The response was incredible, and we now have a vibrant seed collection to share including hundreds of varieties of fruits, vegetables, legumes, and pollinator flowers. These seeds were saved at the end of the last growing season to help make gardening even more sustainable. This spring, we'll begin sharing these seeds with community gardens and community groups like Sustainable Food Edmonton.

We encourage everyone to grow their own food to support their individual food security, whether it's a small planter box, a container garden, a balcony garden, or a backyard plot.
